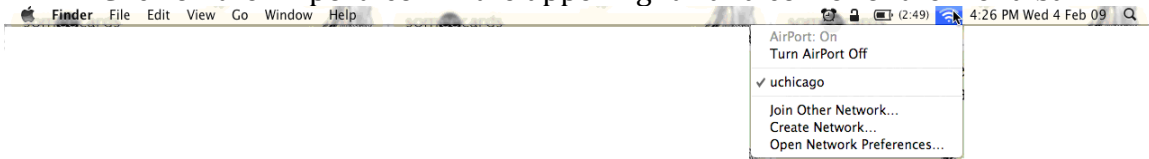


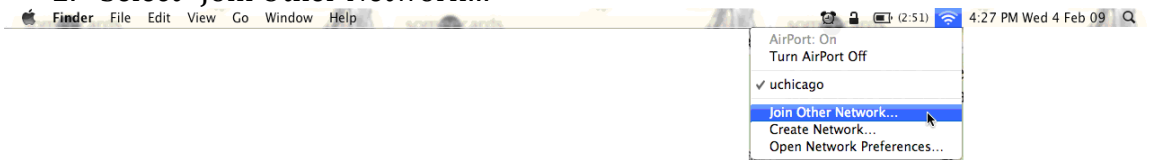
Instruction for Setting up CTS Wireless Internet Access on Mac OS X

The operating system must be Mac OS X 10.4 or later. There is some variation between the screens that will be displayed in Mac OS X 10.4 Tiger and 10.5 Leopard. These instructions come from a Mac running Leopard; if you are unable to configure Tiger or need assistance, please see PC Help.

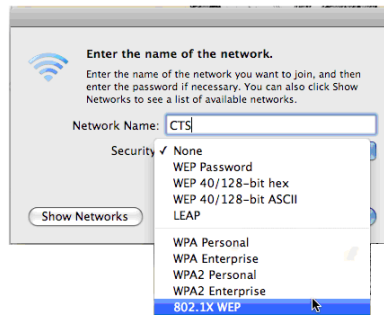
1. Click on the Airport icon in the upper right-hand corner of the Menu bar.



2. Select "Join Other Network..."



3. Enter the network name as "CTS." Under the "Security" dropdown list, select "802.1X WEP"



4. Enter your CTS user name with the "CTS\" prefix in the box labeled "User Name." Enter your CTS password in the box labeled "Password." Make sure that the dropdown menu labeled "802.1X" is set to "Automatic." Select the "Join" button.



Enter the name of the network.
Enter the name of the network you want to join, and then enter the password if necessary. You can also click Show Networks to see a list of available networks.
